Google Classroom provides a synchronous and asynchronous means for students to give feedback to each other.

Tool Features

- The ability to schedule when the discussion posts for students
- An option to attach additional content to the question

Getting Started

1. Google Classroom Question can be accessed through Google Classroom.
2. Log in with an educator account associated with a Google Classroom.
3. Click the Classwork tab and select the Create button.
4. Choose Question from the list.
5. Type the question/prompt and directions (optional) for your students. Choose between multiple-choice and short-answer question types. The short-answer option allows for extended typing (more than a short answer).
6. Add a due date (if desired) and tag it with one of your classroom topics to keep the classwork organized.
7. If there is a YouTube video, document, or link that should accompany your question, you can click the icons at the bottom of the question screen to browse and attach that content.
8. Before pressing the Ask button, slide the settings for whether students can reply to each other and whether students can edit their answers.
9. You can also draft questions to post later and differentiate by assigning a question to specific students.
10. Click the Ask button to immediately post the question.
